

LETTER FROM CARSON

As I reflect on 2025, one word comes to mind: faithfulness not perfection or speed, but the quiet commitment to keep showing up.

Before signing with the Vikings in late August, I had the opportunity to serve alongside our team, especially on the Thy Kingdom Crumb food truck. Being there regularly meeting guests face to face, praying with people, and listening to their stories—deepened my appreciation for what this ministry represents. I saw how consistency builds trust, how dignity changes conversations, and how simply showing up week after week creates space for hope.

These moments reinforced what I've always believed: impact is rarely loud. It often happens quietly around a shared meal, in a prayer on a sidewalk, or in a conversation where someone realizes they are seen and valued. These moments may not feel extraordinary at the time, but they are often where real transformation begins.


Earlier this year, I spent time at Camp Conquerors during a foster care session. Watching kids arrive each carrying their own story and seeing walls come down so quickly was deeply meaningful. Laughing with them and witnessing the joy that came from feeling safe, included, and cared for was powerful. Camp is more than a week away from home; it reminds these kids that they matter and that their story isn't finished.

Throughout 2025, our Outdoor Ministry continued creating spaces where children with complex medical histories and difficult backgrounds could experience joy, confidence, and spiritual growth. Whether at Camp Conquerors or on a Mountain Movers adventure, we saw how time in God's creation, paired with mentorship and discipleship, leaves a lasting impact beyond the experience itself.

Through Thy Kingdom Crumb, we met people right where they were serving meals, listening well, and praying boldly. Food has always been the tool; connection, hope, and healing have always been the goal. Faithfulness in small moments opens doors to deeper connection and lasting change.

What stands out most this year is not just what happened, but why it happened. Every meal served, every camp hosted, and every trip taken was possible because people like you chose to pray, give, serve, and believe alongside us. Your faithfulness fuels this ministry, and we are deeply grateful.

As we look ahead to 2026, we do so with gratitude and expectancy. There is more work to do, more people to reach, and more stories God is writing. Thank you for walking with us and for being part of what God is doing through the AO1 Foundation.

Thy Kingdom Crumb exists to meet the most at-risk people where they are with dignity, compassion, and the love of Christ. Through consistent presence across Indianapolis, our food truck serves free, high-quality meals to individuals and families facing food insecurity, homelessness, and other difficult life circumstances.

BUT THE HEART OF THIS MINISTRY HAS NEVER BEEN JUST ABOUT FOOD.

Week after week, our team shows up in familiar places and new neighborhoods, creating space for conversation, prayer, and genuine connection. Some guests come hungry for a meal. Others come carrying grief, anxiety, addiction, or uncertainty about what comes next. Many return because they know they will be welcomed, listened to, and treated with respect.

In 2025, we saw how faithfulness builds trust. As our team returned consistently to the same streets, shelters, and community partners, relationships deepened. Guests opened up about their lives. Prayer requests were shared. Follow-up conversations happened weeks and months later. Over time, the food truck became more than a place to eat—it became a place of peace, encouragement, and hope.

Our volunteers play a vital role in this work. They don't just serve meals—they listen well, pray boldly, and walk alongside people during some of their hardest moments. Whether de-escalating tension, responding to emergencies, or sitting quietly with someone who needs to be heard, our team reflects Christ through their presence and care.

FOOD REMAINS THE TOOL. HOPE IS THE GOAL: HOPE TO MOVE FORWARD, HOPE TO KEEP GOING, HOPE IN A LOVING FATHER, AND HOPE THAT TODAY DOESN'T HAVE TO LOOK LIKE YESTERDAY.

Through partnerships with local churches, nonprofits, shelters, and outreach organizations, Thy Kingdom Crumb helps connect guests to additional resources and long-term support. We believe transformation happens best in community, and we are committed to pointing people toward environments where they can continue to grow physically, emotionally, and spiritually.



STORIES OF HOPE

HOPE TO KEEP GOING



One young woman returned to the food truck this summer with a smile and a story she was proud to share. She was eight days sober—working, attending meetings, and taking steps toward a healthier future. She admitted the journey was still hard, but it was better. Sometimes, better is the miracle. We celebrated her progress and reminded her she wasn't walking this road alone.

HOPE IN A LOVING FATHER

During a Thanksgiving outreach, a man named Ammon opened up about his long struggle with alcohol addiction. With tired eyes, he shared that he was ready for change. Right there on the sidewalk, he prayed to surrender his life to Christ and committed to begin attending church with a volunteer promising to sit beside him. Grace met him exactly where he was.



HOPE FOR A NEW TOMORROW




One afternoon, a father stopped by the truck in tears, asking for prayer for his 17-year-old daughter who had recently run away. We prayed together and encouraged him. Four days later, his daughter returned home. Weeks after that, he came back to the truck—not for a meal, but to share what God had done and to say thank you.

HOPE THROUGH DIGNITY



At a Mother's Day outreach, one woman named Sabrina took time to write a note to our team. She shared how meaningful it was to be treated with care and respect—something she rarely experienced while homeless.

Camp Conquerors exists to give children facing life-altering medical conditions and children in the foster care system a place to belong. A place where they can unplug, build friendships, grow in confidence, and encounter the love of Jesus in a safe and supportive environment.

For many of our campers, life has required them to grow up quickly. Hospital visits, diagnoses, trauma, and uncertainty are part of their everyday reality. At camp, those labels fade into the background. Here, kids are free to laugh, play, worship, and simply be kids.

In 2025, Camp Conquerors hosted four week-long sessions—two serving children with complex medical backgrounds and two serving youth currently in foster care or recently adopted. Each week was filled with adventure, intentional teaching, worship, small-group conversations, and moments of joy that reminded campers they are not defined by their circumstances.

More than anything, camp is about consistency and presence. Campers return year after year, building trust with leaders and forming friendships that extend far beyond a single week. Through cabin conversations, chapel messages, and shared experiences, kids are invited to explore their identity, ask hard questions, and grow in their faith.

Camp Conquerors is offered completely free of charge. Because of the generosity of supporters, every child is welcomed without barriers removing financial burden and allowing families to focus on what matters most: their child's growth, healing, and hope.

HOPE TO BELONG

Many foster and adopted youth arrived at Camp Conquerors unsure of what to expect. By the end of the week, guarded hearts gave way to laughter, friendship, and worship. Camp became a place where they felt safe, included, and free to be themselves.

HOPE TO BE SEEN

At the close of camp, each camper received a personalized award recognizing the growth and strengths leaders witnessed throughout the week. For many, it was the first time words like these had been spoken over them—reminding them that who they are matters.

HOPE TO GROW IN FAITH

Some of the most meaningful moments at camp happened in quiet cabin conversations. Campers asked hard questions, shared openly, and explored what it means to follow Jesus. These conversations created space for faith to grow naturally, without pressure.

HOPE THAT LASTS

Families shared how the impact continued long after Camp ended. Campers returned home more confident, encouraged, and grounded in their faith. For many, camp became a place they look forward to year after year—a reminder that they belong.






Mountain Movers exists to create once-in-a-lifetime outdoor adventures for children facing life-altering medical conditions. Through hunting, fishing, hiking, and exploration, these experiences provide more than excitement they create space for mentorship, discipleship, and connection.

For many of the kids we serve, life has been shaped by hospital rooms, limitations, and uncertainty. Mountain Movers invites them into a different setting God's creation where they experience freedom, confidence, and accomplishment. Away from the distractions of everyday life, conversations happen naturally. Faith is explored honestly. Relationships are built through shared challenges and trust. Each Mountain Movers adventure is intentionally small and relational. Trips are led by trusted mentors who walk alongside each child not just during the adventure, but often long after it ends. These leaders invest time, ask thoughtful questions, and create space to wrestle with identity, purpose, and how to follow Jesus.

In 2025, Mountain Movers hosted adventures across the country from lakes and rivers to mountains and open fields. Some trips were marked by quiet conversations and reflection. Others were filled with laughter, celebration, and hard-earned success. In every setting, the goal remained the same: to remind each child that they are capable, valued, and not defined by their diagnosis.

Mountain Movers is not about the trophy, the destination, or the activity. It's about who kids become through the experience—and the hope they carry home with them.



HOPE TO BELIEVE YOU ARE CAPABLE

For many Mountain Movers kids, life has been shaped by limitations and uncertainty. On these trips, kids are invited into challenge—hiking farther than they thought possible, landing a first fish, or harvesting an animal after days of effort. Each accomplishment builds confidence and reminds them they are capable of more than they believed.

HOPE THROUGH HONEST CONVERSATION

Some of the most meaningful moments happen between activities—during long drives, quiet mornings, or evenings around a fire. Kids open up about their fears, questions, and faith. Leaders listen, share honestly, and walk alongside them as they explore what it means to trust God in the middle of hard circumstances.

HOPE THAT FAITH CAN GROW ANYWHERE

Mountain Movers trips create space for faith to grow naturally. Whether reading Scripture together, praying after a long day, or talking about identity and purpose while waiting on the water, kids encounter Jesus in a way that feels personal and real—often outside the walls of a church for the first time.

HOPE THAT CONTINUES BEYOND






Sponsorships can be created online or at one of our annual fundraising events. Sponsorship payments can be made as a one-time gift or a recurring donation.


